CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE

Troopers of the NJC,

Another Memorial Day has passed and sometimes I think the significance of this day has been lost. It seems as if it has become more of the unofficial beginning of summer. Memorial Day was borne out of the Civil War and the desire to honor our dead. It was designated as a day to decorate the graves of comrades who had died in defense of our country. Today we honor all veterans of all our services and all our wars. I hope we never lose the meaning of Memorial Day.

In 1915 Miona Michael conceived the idea to wear red poppies on Memorial Day to honor those died serving the nation during war. She was inspired by the poem "In Flanders Field" to do this.

On April 18th, at Arlington National Cemetery, a monument was placed near the Tomb of Unknowns. It honors some 5,000 helicopter pilots and crewmembers who died during the Vietnam War. It says "1961—1975: In Honored Memory of the Helicopter Pilots and Crewmembers who Gave the Full Measure of Devotion to their Nation in the Vietnam War."

One of our own, Ted Fehrenholz, who served in the 11th Airborne Division during World War II, was honored at a NJ Devils Hockey Game for his military service. Ted was a member of B/511 when it made the Los Banos raid to free over 2,000 POWs at Los Banos, Luzon, Phillippines. General Colin Powell has called the raid "a textbook operation for all ages and all armies".

Chapter Member Highlight Medal of Honor Recipient



Jack Jacobs

Jack Jacobs is a highly decorated member of the North Jersey Chapter of the 82nd Airborne Division Association. Jack entered military service as a first lieutenant as a platoon leader in the 82nd Airborne Division in 1966. Later Jack served as a battalion executive officer in the 7th Infantry Division and a battalion commander with the 10th Infantry Regiment. Jack spent two tours of duty in Vietnam. In his first deployment to Vietnam, Jack served with the Military Assistance Command, Vietnam. While working with the ARVN on March 9, 1968, Jack's battalion came under heavy fire from a Viet Cong force. Jack's company commander was injured in the firefight, along with several members of his battalion. Although severely wounded himself, Jack took command of the remaining men, established a secure a defensive line and solely evacuated the company commander, a fellow advisor and 12 other allied soldiers. For his heroic efforts during this firefight, Jack was awarded the Medal of Honor. Jack also received two Silver Stars, three Bronze Stars and two Purple Hearts. Jack retired as a Colonel in 1987.

D-Day Paratrooper jumps again in France at age 96

Tom Rice, 96, the first out the door on June 6, 1944 over Normandy with the 501st parachute Infantry, jumped again in France on June 6, 2018 to commemorate the D-Day anniversary. He also jumped at the 50th anniversary event in 1994.

The 82nd Airborne museum reopens with War on Terror exhibits

The 82nd Airborne Division War Memorial Museum reopened its main exhibit gallery after nearly two years. The four-year, \$2.8 million project was the first major renovation for the 82nd Airborne Division's museum since 1994. The changes allowed the museum to delve into the more recent history of the division's paratroopers in Iraq and Afghanistan and to update displays of artifacts that date to World War I and the earliest days of the division's history, when it was known as the 82nd Infantry Division.
