Chapter Member Highlight Joe Holloway



Joseph Castin Holloway 3rd born August 24, 1946 to Joseph Castin

Holloway Jr and Juanita Quentina Perez Holloway.

I am the oldest of eight siblings and I take my rank seriously as the third in command.

In summer of 1963, I decided with the help of my neighbor, an Army recruiter, to join the Army after my seventeenth birthday on Friday August 24, 1963, on Monday August 27, 1963 I was enlisted and sent to Fort Dix for Basic Training.

My goal was to get my GED, become a Medic, get out of the Army and go to college to become a doctor. I did get my GED and became a Medical Corpsmen in 1963. However, I got the adventure bug to go Airborne. In February 1964 I attended Jump School at Fort Benning, GA. After graduation I was assigned to the 82nd Airborne Division, 307th Medical Battalion at Fort Bragg, North Carolina. As a member of the 82nd with all the training (war games & maneuvers), I became a professional soldier with skills and confidence to perform my duties. In May 1965, the 82nd was tasked to a campaign in the Dominican Republic to counter Communism. We engaged in combat operations that involved a lot of house to house fighting. This mission was concluded in October 1965.

In December 1965, I was ordered to the173rd Airborne Brigade in Viet Nam but upon arrival to Viet Nam in January 1966 I was sent to the 1st Air Cavalry Division 3rd Brigade, 2nd Battalion, 7th Cavalry. There I was assigned to "D" Company Reconnaissance Platoon as their medic (Doc Holiday). I participated in numerus combat and recon missions with some of the most courageous American young men I have ever known. I served in combat until my last week in country on July 24, 1966. I was discharged August 1, 1966 in San Francisco. I was married in December of 1966 and from that union I have three daughters and nine grandchildren. I retired in 2017 from Dassault Falcon Jet where I worked as an Accountant for 19 yrs.

Troopers of the 2nd Brigade Combat Team -82nd Airborne Division arrived back at Fort Bragg in early January after participating in Combined Joint Task Force - Operation Inherent Resolve. This homecoming was the second phase of returning paratroopers of the 2 BCT, which had initially deployed in May, 2020. The mission is deemed a success as the joint forces were able to retake the land that the ISIS terrorists had been using as the caliphate. The reduction in US troops in Iraq is an example of the weakening of the infrastructure that ISIS had built up in the previous years. It is with this joint resolve between nations that the lawful order of the region will be restored and the terrorists will have no place to hide or assemble.
