Chapter Member Highlight Dave Perry



Dave's military service started in 1952

with his basic training at Fort Dix, NJ and then on to Weapons School and Jump School at Fort Benning, GA. He served with "K" Company, 505-AIR from July 1953 to Jan. 1955. During Dave's time with the 82nd, he was involved in the transition from the T-7 to the T-10 parachutes. After Dave's time in the 82nd, he went on to serve in the US Navy, receiving his commission as a Naval Supply Officer in 1965. Dave initially was selected for naval flight school, but due to being 3 months beyond the maximum age for naval trainees, Dave did not attend and instead earned his civilian pilot's license in 1984. Dave went on to serve in Naval Intelligence, eventually becoming the Commanding Officer of the NCIS unit. Dave retired from military service as a Naval Captain (O-6) in 1991.

Dave first became a member of the North Jersey Chapter of the 82nd Airborne Division in 1963. Dave has held every officer position in the chapter and has remained an active member to this day.

Airborne Test Platoon Marker Beautification







The historical marker for the Army Airborne Test Platoon was dedicated by the State of New Jersey. The Marker is located in Robbinsville Township, New Jersey, on north side of NJ 33, just east of Voelbel Road at the site of the former Safe Parachute Company's wooden test towers.

The U.S. Army Parachute Test Platoon began training at the Safe Parachute Company site in Hightstown, NJ in July 1940. The 250-foot tall parachute drop towers located there were used during the Army training and then for the training of Marine Corps paratroopers. Forty-eight enlisted men were selected from a pool of 200 volunteers to become the first US Army paratroopers.

The North Jersey Chapter had taken to the task of beautifying the area around the marker. A local nursery, Tidbury Creek Farms, located in Monroe Township, donated all of the plants and shrubs that were used. Many Thanks to Charlie Moe for spearheading this beautification effort.

More than 1,000 paratroopers with the 1st Brigade Combat Team, 82nd Airborne Division recently were put to the test during an Emergency Deployment Readiness Exercise, which took place from Nov. 30 through Dec. 4 at the National Training Center at Fort Irwin, California. The exercise was a joint operation with the 18th Air Force, Air Force C-130 and C-17 aircraft took the Fort Bragg paratroopers to Fort Irwin. The exercise included numerous enemy engagements, smalland large-unit movements, command post relocations and unexpected mission changes. The primary objective was to seize and secure a large town that was serving as an enemy stronghold.
