

# Chapter Member Highlight Kenneth P. Roth



In 1943, just shy of his 20th birthday, Kenneth was drafted into the United States Army, where he proudly served with the 11<sup>th</sup> Airborne Division as a Gliderman and as a Paratrooper with the 511<sup>th</sup> Parachute Infantry Regiment. He served in New Guinea with the 221stAir Base Medical Company and saw action in the battles in the Philippines. Notably, Ken participated in Leyte (Nov-Dec, 1944), where the 11th Airborne troopers moved from a staging area into the central mountain passes to confront the Japanese and Luzon (Jan-Feb, 1945) where, being part of the "X-Ray Day" airborne operations, The 11th Airborne paratroopers seized a nearby bridge from the surprised Japanese defenders prior to it being demolished, and then turning toward Manila to remove the occupying Japanese from the island. Proud to serve his country, he endured the hardships and unspeakable horrors of that World War II service in the Pacific Theatre and considered himself one of the lucky ones who returned.

# Passing of Lt. Col James "Maggie" Megellas

The 82<sup>nd</sup> Airborne Division has bid farewell to an All American icon, Lt. Col. James "Maggie" Megellas.

Lt. Col. Megellas was assigned to 3rd Battalion, 504th Parachute Infantry Regiment, 1st Brigade Combat Team, 82nd Airborne Division during World War II and first saw combat in Italy where he was wounded in action. He parachuted into The Netherlands during Operation Market Garden and made the legendary Crossing of the Waal River. He also served in Belgium during the Battle of the Bulge where he was awarded the Silver Star for his leadership and valor.

He was one of the original Devils in Baggy Pants and paved the way for the Paratroopers who serve in the Division today.

He passed away April 3rd at the age of 103. This loss will be felt by us all. Remember, Paratroopers never die they, just slip away

#### **New Jersey Combat Veterans Disability Entitlement**

Combat veterans who are New Jersey residents and totally or permanently disabled may qualify for a payment of \$62.50 a month from the state. To qualify, the veteran must have served during a period of war and been a New Jersey resident at the time of entry into military service and when applying for the entitlement. Surviving spouses are also eligible

# 82<sup>nd</sup> Division News

Earlier this month, Fort Bragg welcomed home the remaining paratroopers of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Brigade Combat Team from their 9-month combat deployment in Afghanistan in support of Operation Resolute Support and Operation Freedom's Sentinel.

Fort Bragg also welcomed home the first set of paratroopers of the 1st Brigade who had deployed as part of the Immediate Response Force that had deployed to Iraq. Nearly two months after the rapid-response force was activated amid tensions with Iran, instantly deploying 3,000 soldiers to the Middle East, some are returning home.
