Cpl Steven Koch was with the 1st Battalion, 508th Parachute Infantry Regiment in the 82nd Airborne Division's 4th Brigade. Cpl Steven Koch was killed by an IED on March 3, 2008.

The Chapter will be identified as the New Jersey CPL Steven Koch Chapter. The Chapter will conduct a renaming ceremony at the American Legion in Milltown on November 13th at 12:00. The Chapter requests that all who could attend to make the trip to the Legion to honor CPL Stephen Koch and his family at this event.

Today is October 5, 2021. The Country seems to be getting over the Covid Virus, but there are still problems we must resolve. Hopefully, things will transition to normal as time goes by.

The U.S. Military is still reeling from the tragic withdrawal from Afghanistan in August. The media continues to report the KIAs as 12 Marines and 1 Sailor. The actual count is 11 Marines, 1 Sailor, and 1 Combat Veteran of the 82nd Airborne Division. The Trooper's name is SSG Ryan C. Knauss who was assigned to the 9th Battalion, 8th Psychological Operations Group (Airborne), 1st Special Forces Command. He was 23 years old and was from Corryton, Tennessee. There was also a considerable amount of people left with devastating wounds. Their lives will be forever changed. The North Jersey 82nd Airborne Chapter sent a condolence card along with a donation to the family. Please keep all of these people and their Families in your thoughts and prayers.

At October's Airborne meeting on October 16, the Milltown First Aid Squad conducted a CPR class prior to the meeting. All in attendance took part to learn this life-saving skill.

November's Airborne meeting has been moved up to the second Saturday of the month, November 13. We will be officially changing the Chapter's name from the North Jersey Chapter to the New Jersey Cpl Steven Koch Chapter. Cpl Steven Koch was Killed In Action in Afghanistan is 2008. He is from a local Milltown family who will be present during a short ceremony to commemorate this event. There will also be local dignitaries in attendance. Please come out to this ceremony if you are able.

As, always, please conduct yourself as the U.S. Paratrooper we all aspire to be. The Public will judge others by our behavior.

Chapter Member Highlight Steven Koch



Steven was born 10-25-1984 and was youngest of three

children to Christine and William Koch. Steven entered the Army in 2006 after seeing how much his brother Bill had been affected by terror attacks of 9-11-2001 in NYC. Bill was working there at that time, right across from the world trade center. Steven enlisted in the Army via Fort Dix (Their Ceremony Room is now named in Honor of Corporal Steven Koch), assigned to Army basic training, and then jump school at Fort Benning in Georgia. After graduating basic and paratrooper training, he was assigned to Fort Bragg in North Carolina into the 82nd Airborne Division, 4th Brigade Combat Team, 508th Infantry Regiment. Steven deployed to Afghanistan in January of 2007 to the Sabari District. Steven's platoon was situated in deep hostile territory in the early stages of the Afghanistan War, seeing action daily and taking back much of the lost territory from the Taliban in the process. An improvised explosive device hidden in a car that forced its way thru the army checkpoint, detonated outside the government building where Steven had been located. Steven was killed on March 3, 2008 along with Sgt Robert Rapp of California as a result of the explosion. There were also 4 others killed in the 508th during this deployment.

There is a Memorial at Our Lady of Lourdes School, (Steven's childhood school), honoring CPL Steven Koch and our POW-MIA's, along with paver stones at the East Brunswick Memorial Park and the Milltown American Legion.

82nd Airborne Division News

The 82nd Airborne Division had the privilege of welcoming BG Brandon Tegtmeier, the new Deputy Commanding General for Operations, to the All American Division. BG Tegtmeier previously held the position of Executive Assistant to the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff.

Army's "Scarlet Dragon" uses AI to destroy targets.

The Army recently scanned 7,200 km across four states on the eastern seaboard and used artificial intelligence to find and destroy specific simulated targets in an area the size of a 10-square-foot box. It was all part of the Army's XVIII Airborne Corp artificial intelligence enabled live-fire target identification exercise on Thursday that used nearly 20 platforms and units from each of the other branches. The event was the fourth of its kind for the Scarlet Dragon program, which began in 2020. The Corps, assisted by elements of the Navy, Air Force and Marine Corps, worked with various platforms in all domains. A key ingredient was the National Geospatial-Intelligence Center, which provided satellite imagery for the computer software to find targets.

Due to safety concerns with weather conditions, no steel struck any targets, but Col. Melissa Solsbury, chief data officer for the Corps, told Army Times that the event "achieved machine to machine learning at a scale" previously unseen.

82nd Division News

After nearly two decades of war in the Middle East, the last American troops withdrew from Afghanistan on August 30th. Maj. Gen. Christopher Donahue, commander of the 82nd Airborne Division, was one of the last of American forces to leave. Earlier, Department of Defense officials announced that MG Donahue would join a brigade and battalion under the 82nd Airborne Division that was sent to support the mission of withdrawing Americans and eligible nationals. It was a mission that brought Osama Bin Laden to an end.

MG McKenzie said it was not a cheap mission, costing the lives of 2,461 U.S. service members and civilians, most recently 12 Marines, a sailor and a Fort Bragg soldier — Staff Sgt. Ryan Knauss — killed by an ISIS-K suicide bomber last week.
